3D Scanner:



Starting orthodontic treatment is now a whole lot nicer thanks to the introduction of some state-of-the-art technology at Angle House.

In order to provide the most comfortable and convenient experience for our patients we now have a Core 3D True Definition Digital Scanner to eventually replace alginate impressions.

The digital scanner is an intra-oral scanner. This enables us to view some of the previously tricky to see corners of the mouth during our orthodontic assessment. The data and imaging we take of teeth and jaws using the digital scanner are incredibly detailed and accurate and form the basis of our treatment plans.

This fully digital process can lead to a faster turnaround so our patients can begin treatment sooner. No longer do we need to ship physical impressions; it is an immediate, secure digital transfer to the lab. The scan's accuracy also means we can create an incredibly precise treatment plan which reduces the number of visits patients need to make to us over the course of their treatment. And of course, no more mouthful of impressions! The 3D scan is currently available for Invisalign patients and eventually will be incorporated for all of our orthodontic patients.

Winter Warmer Recipe :- Fabulous Fish Pie

INGREDIENTS:

Potato Topping

5 or 6 large Coliban or Desiree potatoes

Knob butter

1/3 cup warm milk

Salt & Pepper

3 hard boiled eggs, halved lengthways

1/2 cup grated tasty cheese

Fish Filling

4-5 Fillets of firm white fish (eg Cod or Hake)

ITbsp Olive Oil

1 Leek (chopped)

1 large handful of spinach

500ml Cream

1/2 cup grated tasty cheese



METHOD:

Preheat oven to 180 ° C

Boil potatoes in a large saucepan of water with a pinch of salt for approx. 20—30 min. Drain, then add butter, salt and pepper and gradually add warm milk. Mash until mixture is creamy. Set aside.

Heat oil in frypan and gently soften leek. Add spinach and cook gently for a few minutes.

Add cream and gently bring to just boiling, stirring frequently. Add cheese and stir until melted.

Cut fish into bite sized pieces and lay out in a greased pie or baking dish.

Pour over cream mixture, then spread mashed potato evenly over the top. Sprinkle grated cheese over the potato .

Bake in oven for 30 minutes until golden. Place eggs over top of pie. Return to oven for 10 minutes.

Serve with sautéed green vegetables.
